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ROUNDTABLE ON MIGRANT AND REFUGEE EDUCATION

On Friday 23rd March the Three2Six Project and Sacred Heart College co-hosted a Roundtable on Migrant Education with the South African Catholic Parliamentary Liaison Office. It was a wonderful event with more than 100 participants from government, civil society, diplomatic, education and migrant communities.

We were proud to host as our keynote speaker Professor Ann Skelton, who is the Director of the Centre for Child Law at the University of Pretoria, a member of the United Nations Committee on the Rights of the Child and the UNESCO Chair for Education Law in

Over the last 10 years nearly 600 children have transitioned from Three2Six into mainstream schools, with 300 more currently accessing an education thanks to the project. However, more than 500 children are on the waiting list in Johannesburg with thousands more across the country denied access to an education.



In February our children got visitors from the democracy prep public school in New York, United States. Every year the school offers their grade 12 to come to South Africa for one week and they have the opportunity to explore a different country, with all the diversity. They spend two afternoons with playing games, reading and doing sport in all the grades.

We share the vegetables with the three2six families who find it difficult to afford a full meal every day.
