# First aid training





From Monday, 12 August to Wednesday, 14 August, the Three2Six teachers and campus coordinators as well as our new volunteer attended a First Aid training to upgrade their First Aid certificates. This was critical as they work with our children on a daily basis.

They attended the training for Level 1 and 2. This session was run by Darren Smith from First Aid Priority in collaboration with Peta Anne Munnik, the Sacred Heart College nurse.

This three-day training encompassed lessons as well as a lot of practical exercises. Among other activities, we learnt about emergency scene assessment, how to treat and dress different types of wounds and how to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on both children and adults. These certificates will be upgraded again in 3 years.

The project is still actively fundraising to ensure its sustainability and that it has the ability to open doors for more children in 2020.

If you are a corporate company based in South Africa, we have interesting news for you on how you can benefit from partnering with us:

On the 31st of May 2019, the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) published 4 new gazettes amending the BBBEE legislation. One of the most important changes published was around Skills Development

Prior to these gazettes, organisations needed to spend 6% of their annual wages and salary bill on upskilling black people in order to get 8 points on the Generic BBBEE scorecard. The amendments have split this now with:

1.3,5% of wages and salary bill to be spent on upskilling black people for 6 points 2.2,5% of wages and salary bill to be spent on "Bursaries for Black Students at Higher Education Institutions" for 4 points.

There was a 6-month implementation period for this new legislation, meaning any business with a year end after 30 November 2019 would have to include this new calculation as part of their BBBEE audit verification. The DTI have since further clarified that Grades 9 to 12 are considered to be higher education studies, meaning bursaries for students studying in those grades would count towards the bursaries calculation.

If you would like to support some of our children to enter into mainstream schooling or support those who have already transitioned, please do get in touch with us.

501C3 - Section 501(c)(3) is the portion of the US Internal Revenue Code that allows for federal tax exemption of non-profit organizations, specifically those that are considered public charities, private foundations or private operating foundations.
