Brother Fachi's Visit



BMI measurements at Observatory Girls'



Before Observatory Girls' Primary School closed for its mid-term break, our children had their Body Mass Index (BMI) measurements taken and answered a questionnaire on their eating habits. The same was performed at our Sacred Heart College and Holy Family College.

Those measurements are carried out once a term on all our campuses. It helps the project keep track of the children's physical development to monitor their well-being. It also ensures that the food provided to them is nutritious and adapted to their needs so they are able to learn and actively participate in the classrooms.

Food parcel distribution

Twice a month on Thursdays, our children receive two vegetable parcels each at the Sacred Heart College campus. They take them to their homes to supplement their meals. This project's initiative is aimed at improving the family units' food security.

Our children always look forward to the distribution and there is always much excitement when they receive their parcels.





Background information: the program started in 2013, as a food parcel program with food collected from supermarkets. A year later, the day school parents of Sacred Heart College joined to organize it. That is when the food parcels changed to vegetable parcels.

We are deeply thankful for this wonderful initiative from the day school parents.


