## WHAT WE DO

Three2Six, which was created in 2008, is a Johannesburg-based bridging education project for primary school refugee and migrant children who cannot access state schooling in South Africa. Our goal is to support them to integrate into a public school.

#### We provide the following to our learners:

- Quality education. They are given strong foundations in subjects such as English, Mathematics and Life Skills every weekday, and enjoy extramural activities such as judo, Ipad classes and outings.
- All necessary educational material, including textbooks, stationery and uniforms.
- A healthy meal and snack a day.
- Safe transport to and from school.

These services are provided free as the families we support come from impoverished communities and cannot afford them without assistance.

The project also provides employment and professional development for its refugee teachers who struggle to find employment in South Africa.
